
UPCOMING EVENTS



It gives me a chance to remind you to renew your membership when it comes due. Your Bridge is striving to maintain our membership and at the same time attract new ones. Our main function as Canadian Power Squadrons is to provide ways and means to keep our waterways safe for boaters. We do this mainly through education. One reason for not renewing that I hear a lot is the fact that we sold our boat because we are too old to handle her. There are many good reasons not to rejoin because of different circumstances, but even if you personally can't enjoy the pleasures you once had. By renewing your membership you will still help the CPS provide safety for new and other boaters which has been our goal from the beginning. I have been a member for quite a while but every year I still look forward to being presented my Merit Mark Award. This reward

goes to any member who puts in twenty or more hours of voluntary work for CPS-ECP in that year. In saying that I would encourage any member of our Squadron to become a Bridge member. You would be part of a very important function of Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons. Most people don't know that back in 1912, Hellmann's Mayonnaise was manufactured in England. A pleasure Craft License is valid for 10 years. At the end of that period, you must renew your license.

If you change your name, address, or particulars of the pleasure craft after you obtain a Pleasure Craft License, you must update your license.

You may renew or update a license by regular mail or online, using the procedures outlined about at <u>Obtaining a Pleasure Craft License</u>.

I contacted the Boating Safety hotline and clarified the matter of 10 years. If your vessel license was issued prior to 2010 and you have not asked for a duplicate or an update to the information that license is valid for life. If you have asked for either a duplicate or an update since 2010 that license is valid for 10 years from the date of issue.

A change has also recently been enacted regarding the number of flares that are required in vessels up to 12 meters. If the vessel has a maritime radio and a licensed radio operator or if there is a cell phone on board the number of flares required is half of what was previously required. Not more than 50% of required flared may be Class D (smoke). As this is a very new change to the regulations boaters may encounter enforcement personnel that are not aware of the revised requirements.
