Training Officer's Report ~ P/D/Cdr Larry Hicks

Happy Spring (just about anyway)! As I write this, the weatherman predicts wind chill tonight of -18. Not a promising outlook for an early launch. Oh well, I'm not ready anyway.

Meanwhile, in the warmth of the classrooms in Ingersoll and Tillsonburg, the boating students are about to hover over the final nights of classes and the final exams. Good Luck to them all and a big thank you to them for their time and effort to become safer boaters. If they are now safer boaters then so are we by association.

I hope that many of you were able to attend either the Toronto or London Boat Shows. CPS had booths at both and answered a lot of questions from those visitors to the shows. Many of the questions were focused on the new requirements being implemented by Transport Canada on April 15th, 2011. This of course refers to the new format for Online Testing, which will be comprised of several modules which the student will have to peruse in order to progress to the exam. Each module will be a lesson in itself complete with a quiz which must be successfully answered in order to advance to the following lessons. Once all the modules have been answered with a minimum 80% average, the student will then be able to proceed with the exam portions which will be an open book test but restricted by a time element - too slow - sorry...try again. Note that the exam portion is administered by Transport Canada. As of April 15th we have a level playing field because Transport Canada has required every provider of Pleasure Craft Operators Cards (note every provider) now has a 50 question exam and the same protocol leading up to the exam - eg. Module, Quiz, Module, Quiz etc to the exam. The exception is that our card will be the only card that is recognized by NASBLA (National Association of State Boating Law Administrators) and the United States Coast Guard. This is a very expensive upgrade for every provider, costing big money to adapt to the new regs. The end result is well worth it though, because everybody now will have some education, which is a good thing for sure. But fear not, those who would rather have personal instruction in a classroom need only call or email me to sign up. Transport Canada are compiling questions and issuing exams through the various course providers with changes approximately every six months. I'm focusing on the PCOC course because of the changes but don't forget the full boating course, all of our other advanced courses and the elective courses which are open not only to members but also the interes

CPS is also reaching out to the associate members by making them eligible for positions on the Bridge. This amendment was passed at the Governing Board meeting in February. The best way to enjoy being a squadron member is to "participate". Watch our events calendar and join in - you're most welcome.

In closing, I wish you all fair winds, calm seas and a safe voyage until the June newsletter.
