UPCOMING EVENTS


The Tillsonburg AGM is being held this year on April 20th at the Cornell Hall at 7:30 P.M. Plan to attend and support your new Bridge.

Key Facts About Drowning

372,000 people die from drowning every year. There are about 42 drowning deaths every hour, everyday. The drowning death toll is almost two-thirds that of malnutrition and well over half that of malaria. Drowning is one of the 10 leading causes of death for people aged 1-24 years in every region of the world. Globally, over half of all drowning deaths are among those aged under 25 years. Males are twice as likely to drown as females. Drowning rates in low and middle income countries are over three times higher than in high-income countries. Alcohol use around water is an important risk factor for drowning in many countries especially for adolescents and adults.

Fishing Facts in Ontario

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry operates nine hatcheries or fish culture stations which produce up to 8 million fish for stocking into more than 1,200 waterbodies each and every year. We also hold 18 captive brood stocks which we use for breeding. Wild strains of Lake Trout and Brook Trout are raised at facilities like the modernized Dorion facility near Thunder Bay and the Chatsworth facility near Owen Sound to help rehabilitate local fish stocks. We are working to restore Atlantic Salmon to Lake Ontario at the newly rebuilt Normandale facility near Simcoe, while helping to prevent the extinction of Aurora Trout in northeastern Ontario and developing culture practices for other rare species at other facilities.

We also stock fish to maintain, enhance and create angling opportunities. Walleye, Chinook, Rainbow Trout, Brown Trout and Splake are all prized by sport anglers. By stocking these fish, we also help conserve biodiversity by reducing angling pressure on stocks that are sensitive to over-harvest. Every year, more than one million people go fishing in Ontario. Eating fish is healthy, but some fish from Ontario's waters can contain natural or man-made contaminants. Before you eat fish from Ontario waters, check the **Guide to Eating Ontario Fish** for advice on:

How to choose fish with the lowest levels of contaminants

How to prepare fish to reduce contaminants.

Stop Aquatic Hitchhikers

Always dispose of your unwanted bait and the contents of your bait bucket on land, 30 meters from the water's edge, or in the trash.

Clean: Remove all visible plants, mussels and mud from your boat, trailer and other equipment. Dispose of them in a suitable trash container or on dry land.

Drain: Drain the water from your motor, live well and bilge before you leave the boat launch.

Dry: Let your boat and trailer dry in the sun for at least 5 days to kill many aquatic invasive species that you can't see.

Note:

12.3 ELECTIONS

- 12.3.1 At each District Annual General Meeting there shall be elected by ballot of those members entitled to vote, all elected Officers, as set out in the notice of meeting, provided that if a candidate for any office is unopposed, that candidate may be elected by a nominal single ballot cast by the Secretary in favour of that candidate.
- 12.3.2 Persons elected or appointed shall serve until the next District Annual General Meeting or until their successors shall have been elected or appointed.
- 12.3.3 As per 12.3.2, Members may be appointed by the District Executive Committee as deemed necessary for the administration of the affairs of the District.
- 12.3.4 A District Financial Review Committee shall be appointed. The person(s) appointed to the District Financial Review Committee shall not during their term as a committee member be or become an elected Officer of the District, a member of the District Council or a member of any other committee of the District.
- 12.3.5 No member of a District shall be eligible for election at any District Annual General Meeting unless nominated by the District Nominating Committee or by a petition in writing signed by not less than five (5) Members of the District of which two (2) must be from a Squadron other than that of the petitioner who shall confirm the consent of their nominee to such nomination. All such nominations:
 - (a) by the District Nominating Committee shall be filed with the District Secretary at least four (4) weeks prior to the date of the meeting at which such election shall take place:
 - (b) by petition shall be filed with the District Secretary not less than two (2) days prior to the date of the meeting at which such election shall take place.
